

## **Equipment & Materials List**

Weaving in Collaboration with Nature Starts Fri 3<sup>rd</sup> October 2025 at 2pm

## Students will need:

- A variety of different coloured yarns, preferably in different thicknesses and yarn textures
- Sewing or tapestry needle at least one, with an eye to accommodate the above yarns. Recommended eye size between 16-18 for thicker yarns, and 20-22 for finer yarns
- Approximately postcard size pieces of card such as mount card, cardboard packaging, which is sturdy enough to weave around. Any shape rectangle or square is fine. Additionally, you can use pieces of wood board or wall tiles.
- A selection of foraged natural matter to include in your weavings such as dried flowers / grasses / branches / leaves
- Anyone of the following masking tape, washi tape or double-sided
- Natural objects such as rocks, scallop shells, discs of wood
- Scissors ideally small sewing scissors with narrow blades so you can get in close to trim.
- A tapestry loom, or frame loom. Approximately A5 sized or larger. If this isn't available, you could use a straight flat sized picture frame. Or a cardboard weaving board.

## **Suggested / Preferred Suppliers:**

- Yarns: Hopefully you have a local haberdashery shop and charity shops can be good but otherwise try the Handweavers studio, Sostrene Green, Loop knitting, John Lewis and Hobbii
- Needles and sewing scissors- as above or Amazon
- Natural matter hopefully your garden or local surroundings. For dried flowers you could try Etsy, DRIED or Shida preserved.
